According to the Moore County GOP, a huge number of people are voting early. Entering the final week of one-stop early voting, 33,932 Moore County ballots have been accepted (as of October 25), which is 114% of the total early vote in 2016, and 69.2% of our total vote four years ago. - Jewelry - \$227. Thank you, Sandy Fowler, for selling our "Right Wing Bling."




Also, we have new items to sell in November and December, including this beautiful Christmas Ornament honoring the 100th anniversary of the women's right to vote.
