
- President

About the N. Carolina GOP budget override



The headlines were all about Republicans allegedly hijacking Governor Roy Cooper's veto of a two-year budget.

But what actually matters is that the new budget approved by the North Carolina House includes an income tax cut that will provide relief to all taxpayers, but **will disproportionately benefit low income households** by

raising the standard deduction. This new round of income tax relief follows the personal income tax rate cut that took effect in North Carolina at the start of 2019, with the rate dropping from 5.499% to 5.25%.

The new budget also increases the job-creating capacity of North Carolina employers by **reducing the state's franchise tax**, a tax that most states do not impose. [Read more.](#)




POW/MIA Ceremony at Carthage Veterans Memorial
